


A workplace campaign gives employees the opportunity to unite toward a common goal. Employees and customers are proud to support a business that gives back and strengthens its community.



What does a Workplace Campaign look like?

United Way staff will schedule a presentation to your employees with your designated Employee Coordinator. We'll share all about United Way of Central Florida and leave marketing materials. Employees are encouraged to designate a gift through their paycheck or make a gift within specific dates. These gifts are totaled and are given under the umbrella of your organization.

Workplaces can also host an event with the proceeds benefitting United Way of Central Florida. These events also contribute towards their overall donation. Examples include the Judd Jog 5K, Sheriff's Haunted Jail Tour, private movie screenings and an adult skate night to name a few.

What are the UWCF Initiatives?



Early Childhood Education

Research shows that children who enter school ready to learn are more likely to graduate high school on time. Statistically, students who graduate high school are more likely to find a job that pays a livable wage, live healthier lives, stay out of the judicial system and have children who also graduate high school on time. Through early childhood education partners and Success By 6 programs: The Carol Jenkins Barnett United Way Children's Resource Center, Master Teachers, Parent Lending Library and more, we are creating a world where every child has the opportunity to succeed.



Academic Achievement

School is full of obstacles. For some, the challenges of these formative years are too great to overcome alone and can lead students to make the unfortunate choice to drop out. That is why UWCF and partners are working every day to prevent that outcome through tutoring, mentoring and more.



Community Partnership School (Crystal Lake Elementary)

The community partnership school model is based on a strategy of forming a long-term partnership among four core partners: a school district, a university or college, a community-based nonprofit and a healthcare provider. This comprehensive model of a community school leverages the social and institutional capital of partners, making it possible for the school to offer resources and services that address the needs of the community. The Community Partnership School goals include school readiness; student academic success; physical; social and emotional health; and parent and community engagement.



Financial Stability

UWCF addresses the root cause of problems to build a better future for individuals and our community. Our partnership for free tax preparation helped 10% of tax prep clients begin permanent savings accounts with the goal to supplement retirement. We provide budgeting expertise and saving disciplines to help families build a better future, and we provide individuals with job-skills training for increased income. UWCF partners help families manage debt and improve their credit, placing individuals on a path to financial independence.



Health

When it comes to accessing health services, a person’s zip code should never be a deterrent to success, nor should it be a barrier to improved health. Yet for many, that’s a daily reality. By making it easier for individuals to access substance abuse programs, receive quality health care and access nutritious foods, we’re working to help everyone get—and stay—healthy.

We know that hunger is a pervasive problem across our community. Many families often have to choose between buying groceries or paying rent and the effects can be devastating – from poor health and malnourishment to impaired child development. By increasing access to healthy foods, 21 mobile food pantries are helping eliminate hunger for thousands of residents across Polk, Hardee and Highlands counties.



Basic Needs

When local residents—no matter their socioeconomic status—are devastated by natural disasters, acts of violence, mental health concerns, homelessness or grief, UWCF and partners provide critical services to help stabilize short-term crises.





What volunteer opportunities are available?

Healthy Food Pantries

Food Distribution Sites around Polk, Hardee and Highlands counties on a variety of days and locations.

Day of Caring Service Projects


Service projects are planned throughout the year for individuals or groups helping with a variety of activities benefitting UWCF partner agencies.

Leadership Giving Association (LGA) Committees

For individuals giving on an LGA level, they can volunteer on different committees within Women United, Young Leaders Society or Alexis de Tocqueville. These committees help plan events, recruit members, and facilitate service projects.

Community Investment Teams

These volunteers work together to evaluate funding requests each spring. Teams participate in site visits, study applications and assess the effectiveness of services before recommending funding allocations. Community Investment Teams meet once a month from March through June.
