A meeting of the Board of Directors of United Way of Central Florida was held on January 29, 2025 with members, guests and staff present as recorded above.



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Call to Order & Welcome: Brian Haas, Chair

Brian welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order at 8:40am. He announced March meeting will be moved from march 20th to March 27th, due to Spring Break.

Consent Agenda: Brian Haas, Chair

Brian presented the Consent Agenda, which was sent out to the board via email prior to the meeting, then asked if there were any comments or questions on the Consent Agenda. With none, Don Elwell made a motion to approve, Rick Garcia seconded; motion passed with no objections.

Appropriations: Kelsey Jaffer

Kelsey presented UWCF's intent on doing a legislative ask. UWCF is requesting \$250,000 to address food insecurity through bi-weekly food distributions and Pop-up food drops in Highlands and Hardee County. In addition, the appropriation would improve health outcomes and provide community support and resources to reduce disparity by providing community wellness navigators who attend the food distributions and food drops. Navigators will provide resources to assist with financial stability, childcare, educational support, housing assistance, and more.

After Kelsey's presentation, there were follow-up questions from board members with responses from Kelsey and Christina:

- Brittany Sale: Who are we applying from? R: Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services
- Lauren Feaster: What happens if we don't get the funds? R: We will continue to reach out to current donors and seek grant funding. Currently the Avon Park location is closed until we find stable funding
- Michael Tamney:
 - i. What is our target number? R: 200 families per distribution
 - ii. Will there be different requirements from State funding vs County funding? R: State is usually more lenient than County funding in terms of restrictions
- Don Elwell: Is there an opportunity for local officials to get involved? R: Absolutely, we appreciate the support at a local level, having these conversations when possible.
- Tip: Does this align with the legislation's priorities? R: Yes, current priorities are disaster relief, and Dave Shepp is meeting with legislators to find the right fit for our program.

After the questions were answered, Callie Neslund made a motion to approve, *Don Elwell seconded; motion passed with no objections*.

Key Updates: Christina Criser Jackson

Christina shared department updates:
